Have you ever noticed groups of birds flying together during certain times of the year? Where do you think they are going? It is possible the birds are on their annual migration.

Bird migration is the regular journey taken by many bird species each year. Nearly two thousand species of birds migrate long distances. But why do they do it?

The main reason why birds migrate is to find food. For example, the most common pattern in bird migration involves the birds flying north during the spring and flying south during autumn. There is plenty of food for birds to eat in northern places during the summer. However, during the winter months, food sources are covered with snow! Therefore, the birds fly toward the equator and warmer climates, where food is available year-round. During spring, the birds fly north again to lay their eggs and raise their young in more moderate climates.

You may be wondering how birds know when it is time to migrate. Migrating birds are genetically programmed to fly long distances. The birds sense it's time to fly based upon the amount of daylight. As the days grow shorter, birds feel winter drawing near. So, they fly south once more and then repeat the cycle every year!
