**imagine: v.** to make an idea or picture of something in your mind

**item: n.** a single thing in a set or on a list

**object: n.** a thing that you can see or touch but is not alive

**remember: v.** to keep something in your mind, or bring it back into your mind

**road: n.** a long, hard surface built for vehicles to drive on

**sale: n.** the act of selling something

**unusual: adj.** different and not ordinary, often in a way that is interesting
