The first recorded instance of someone using a lens to assist sight is in Roman times. The Roman dramatist Seneca used to read by looking at books through a globe of water which acted as a lens and magnified the writing. However, it was not until around 1000 CE that the glass blowers in Italy produced reading stones made of solid glass. Those who learned how to produce these reading stones later made them into shapes that could be held in a frame in front of the eyes. This design was similar to modern magnifying glasses, which make things appear larger than they actually are.

The first mention of glasses appears in an Italian manuscript dated 1289. It is thought by most historians that glasses were first invented in Italy between 1285 and 1289 by monks or craftsmen, such as glass blowers. However, the Italian Salvino D'Armato is credited with inventing the first form of eyeglasses around 1284, although this claim has not been proven.

In 1305 or 1306, Giordano da Rivalto of Pisa said in a sermon that he knew about spectacles being invented about twenty years before. He did not say who the inventor was. Another monk, Alessandro da Spina of Pisa, is also credited as being the first inventor of spectacles, along with D'Armato, but no concrete evidence supports this idea. The name of true inventor of spectacles remains lost in history.
